### Principal's Message

Hello Otter Families,

Another week is flying by! Let's back up to Friday, March 15 by visiting **STEM NIGHT** facilitated by 4th grade teacher Stefanie Pechan. You will be able to virtually visit by viewing some photos from the evening. Our students and families experienced amazing stations and demonstrations! Mrs. Pechan prepared the following narrative relevant to the origin of her STEM Club:

STEM Club was founded in 2010 by Mrs. Pechan. It started with a small group of scienceenthused students meeting at lunchtime to perform science experiments and explore other areas of STEM.

After a while, this group decided they would like to teach others what they had been learning and the first school-wide STEM rotations were held. Once per month, the STEM Club students would put on their lab coats and lead the rest of the RHD students through various stations during lunchtime (one day was for grades K-2 and another day for grades 3-5). The STEM Club even led a STEM PD for both RHD and FG Elementary school teachers. The program expanded with more students joining and the idea for hosting a family science night was born.

The STEM Club students, under Mrs. Pechan's guidance, plan and organize the stations to have at the family night. They learn how to plan to have enough materials for the entire student population, work within a budget, write and practice their talking points for presentations, create ways to advertise the event (flyers and signs), and continue to share their love of learning with others. In the past year, the STEM Club has teamed up with the PTA to add a fundraising element in the form of a food truck and silent auction.

Fast forward 14 years later and the program is still going strong. The annual family STEM Night takes place in the spring. Interested 4th and 5th graders should look for the bulletin announcement with the sign-up information in the fall (or go see Mrs. Pechan).

Robert Down held a successful Secure Campus Drill this past Monday. Drills are important to hold regularly with reminders retrieved from our BIG FIVE Safety packets. Students were cooperative, and due to the type of drill, were able to continue learning without disruption.

Tuesday was a big day! Superintendent Adamson made time for a Site Visit to RHD and enjoyed a tour of several classes. We mostly visited our primary grades, received "sparkles" from Mrs. Perkins, made "change" with 2nd graders during their money unit, and watched energetic TK students do some balancing moves! Next visitation will include our upper grades.

Our Student Advisory Group of 4th and 5th grade students met with District Curriculum Director Buck Roggeman in our lovely garden to share their views about RHD. They shared wish lists, proposed improvements, and what works well! Good discussion over a pizza lunch!

Our second graders performed a delightful musical program for families Monday evening as well as Tuesday morning for our students entitled *Feathers, Scales, and Furry Tails.* So many memorized songs paired with lots of energy :) Festive and fun!

Our generous group of PTA volunteers met Tuesday evening to discuss the many upcoming RHD events. Topics included safety, Open House, 5th grade activities...the list goes on. This group is very much appreciated by our staff and families for enriching our students' lives. Stay tuned for their newsletter and get ready for lots of action.

On Wednesday, I dined with a dozen RHD Otters in the beautiful school garden complete with juicy popsicles! These students were the lucky winners of the Caught Being Good Lunch Club, Garden Docent Ms. Heidi was present! She showed us the thriving vegetables and the "Quiet Room" she created with comfy seating and lots of books.

Staff member Alex Jenner deserves much credit, along with Michelle Ford for making the Spelling Bee happen Wednesday night! School Board Trustee Carolyn Swanson, PGPD Resource Officer Andrea Hill, and former PGUSD Preschool Teacher Jennifer Ross graciously accepted the roles being the judges! Our 22 spellers are to be congratulated for participating and our winners are: Sarah Moss, Arina Baigrie, Charlie Watson, and Gabriel Hemmesch. Well done!

Here is a parking reminder to parents and families dropping off and picking up their children. Our drop off locations are on Pine and Spruce. Please, after dropping off your students, leave your spot in a timely manner to allow other parents to drop off. 


















# Please Read: Allergy Alert Letter

#### Hello Robert Down Families,

This year, we have some schoolmates in grades 2 through 5 with life-threatening allergies to eggs, tree nuts, peanuts, and milk requiring Epi-Pen treatment if exposed to eggs and foods containing tree nuts, peanuts, and milk. To maintain the highest level of safety, all of the 2nd grade classrooms will be <u>compulsory</u> egg, tree nut, and peanut-free classrooms. We ask that all Second Grade classroom families not send foods to school with their child which contain tree nuts, peanuts, and eggs.

Mr. Keller will be discussing with all grade levels the importance of being safe at the lunch tables and not playing with milk cartons by purposely pouring liquids onto trays, onto the table tops or ground, and not stomping on cartons to hear them "pop". He will also share with students the importance of using hand wipes or washing hands after eating any food allergy products to keep playground equipment safe for all students.

The best way to determine if foods are allergy-free snacks is to read the label since most brands have a warning statement or allergen list. Be aware of phrases like this:

May Contain Peanuts
Processed on shared equipment with Peanuts
Manufactured in a facility that also processes Peanuts
Contains Peanut or Peanut Ingredients



In addition, we will encourage students to care for their food properly at school by not not sharing food with others, not throwing food, and not carelessly spilling food onto others in order to eliminate food allergy exposure and cross contamination in eating areas shared by multiple grade levels.
